After the Fall: Time for a New Deal

The reality of poverty and inequities, as perceived from communities and grassroots is different from the top-down views. Citizen reports from over 60 countries show in this edition of Social Watch that we are a long way from attaining the Millennium Development Goals. Further, Social Watch research shows that poverty reduction has globally slowed down since 2000. *After the Fall* concludes that a **comprehensive redefinition** of our approach to development is needed.

Why is "more of the same" not the solution? What works? How do we link social development with the climate, food and financial crises?
