


Social Watch Pakistan History

- Indus Development Organization was the first contact for Social Watch (2004 2007)
- The Social Watch Coordinator met with Chairperson CSSP in 2007 in Glasgow (CIVICUS Assembly)
- Social Watch invited the Chairperson to attend regional workshop organized in Cambodia in 2007.
- The SW assigned the task to organize SW Pakistan Chapter.
- CSSP mobilized individuals and organizations to be part of the Social Watch Coalition.
- Developed Social Watch Pakistan Strategy (draft)
- Got donor commitment to provide seed money for consultation with stakeholder.

Why Social Watch Pakistan?

- Instability of political process.
- Military regimes
- Disintegration among the Civil Society
- Ineffectiveness of national coalitions
- Lack of inter-provincial harmony
- Increase role of media/ NGOs
- No proper utilization of the flow of information
- Increase in extremism



Proposed Goal

■ The overall goal is to expand outreach of social watch chapter in Pakistan to provide greater transparency and accountability to the governance institutions for sustained social development of the society at wider scale.

Proposed Objectives:

■ The overall objectives of the project is to assess and determine the scope of the Social Watch Programme towards strengthening mechanisms for increased transparency and accountability to state institutions.

Specific Objectives:

- Conduct consultative meetings, seminars, and visits to the potential organizations, individuals and institutions for getting their views about scope of Social Watch in Pakistan.
- Conduct Stakeholder Assessment and Risk Analysis of Social Watch Pakistan Coalition.
- Develop data base for Social Watch Pakistan Coalition.
- Develop Social Watch Pakistan Strategy by engaging the key stakeholders.
