The event was co-organized by Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, Social Watch and Global Policy Forum and took place on 17 September 2010. The reality of poverty and inequities, as perceived from communities and grassroots is different from the top-down views. The contributions of citizen groups from over 60 countries for the Social Watch Report 2010 entitled "After the Fall. Time for a New Deal" shows that we are a long way from attaining the Millennium Development Goals. Further, Social Watch research shows that poverty reduction has globally slowed down since 2000. It concludes that a comprehensive redefinition of our approach to development is needed.

Social Watch is also co-organizing a series of discussion panels with government and civil society representatives about concrete actions needed to achieve progress in poverty eradication and social justice.
